How do ideas for innovation in eHealth come about? What are the roles for employees, or the patients themselves in this process? Co-creation new digital services in healthcare entails bringing in users on all levels from early idea and planning stages all the way to finished new products and services!

Co-Creation is linked to several other methodologies like, Design Thinking and Usability, or Living Labs. Co-creation might happen between individuals and organizations, between several organizations, or between academia, government and enterprises (e.g., "Triple helix").

**Topics include, but not limited to; contributions could enlighten research and practice on:**

- Barriers and enablers for successful co-creations within the context of eHealth;
- Examples of co-creations from real life action- and design research;
- Conceptual papers enlightening themes like crowd-sourcing ideas from the general public, suppliers, patients, next-of-kin or front stage employees in healthcare;
- The use of social media or Internet communities in developing and improving healthcare, both physical and mental health.
