Digital products are shaping our behaviour, our decisions and our interactions. The ELIDT special track focuses on the presentation of the empirical findings of the e.g. manipulation behaviour constituted by as well as the deceiving behaviour applied in the design of the digital products. The combination of the ethical, social, engineering approaches, legal perspectives and methods results in insights that can contribute to digital product design, public discussion on information technologies and legislation.

But not only the digital products themselves influence our behaviour, interaction and perception of the usefulness of a product, but also the communication in the digital and print communities. Media outlets, can influence or tendency to see and use digital technology in our everyday life as well as business context.

ELIDT aims to focus research on these topics as well as to provide some insights into the described issues based on quantitative and qualitative research results.

The main idea of ELIDT is to highlight the interdisciplinary approach and empirical methods to design, analysis and usage of digital technology as well as to provide a space for interdisciplinary research and discussion.

Topics include, but not limited to

- Dark patterns in design of digital products
- Dark patterns in the design of websites
- Cookie banners and their compliance to legislation
- Dark patterns in Cookie banners
- Sentiment analysis in new media reporting on digital transformation technological innovation
- Ethical consideration in software engineering and digital product design
- Consideration of values in digital product design
- Operationalization of ethical principles in software design
- Digital platforms and their effect on labor market and conditions
