In 2008 and 2009 her masters' students have produced theses on ReMoteCare: Health Monitoring with Streaming Video and Portable Emergency Medical Information System for Elderly Care and she currently has five project students working with her on a variety of wireless sensor development kits such as Crossbow's Zigbee MicaZs, Sun's Java Sunspots and Toumaz's Digital Plaster. Through industry and research connections (e.g. Professor Matt Welsh of Harvard University, UTS Faculty of Nursing, Midwifery and Health, Cisco, Royal North Shore Hospital Cardiology Centre and Citrix) Elaine has developed a valuable network of international scholars working in the fields of Internetworking, Communications and Distributed Applications (especially Wireless Sensor Networks and Mobile Applications). Dr Lawrence was Chair of the highly successful International Conference of Mobile Business (2005) and remains a member of the ICMB standing committee. She has run tracks on Mobile Technology and Business in International conferences in the USA, Norway and the West Indies. She receives many requests from leading international scholars in the field to visit the Faculty and participate in research forums. . She has been the Program Leader of the popular Masters of Internetworking and is a qualified Cisco Certified Academic instructor and author of leading textbooks on Internet Commerce as well as Cisco Academy online material.

Currently Elaine is a Chief Investigator on **two Australian Research Grants** totalling \$385,000 which are due to conclude at the end of 2009.
