Long-term monitoring of biomedical parameters is one of the main objectives for the development of new models of prevention, treatment, and diagnosis of the main diseases affecting the health of the general population.

Wearable technology, with its recent developments, allows the development of devices capable of adapting to the deformable nature of the human body thanks to ever smaller, lighter and more flexible systems that allow them to be integrated into everyday objects, like t-shirts, glasses, shoes, or watches.

Examples of this technology are sensorized textile and flexible devices that can be used for monitoring the user's biomedical parameters or for treating patients (physiological detection, human movement analysis, electrical stimulation, home rehabilitation, biofeedback).

The purpose of this special session is to connect researchers in the field of wearable technology for monitoring user health, share ideas, conceptual approaches and recent advances in this field to outline possible innovative solutions, new paradigms and emerging problems.

Topics include, but not limited to

- Flexible sensors and devices
- Stretchable sensor and devices
- e-textiles
- Biofeedback
- Bioelectrodes and bioelectronics
- Wearable biomedical sensors
- Physiological sensing
- Ambulatory human motion/activity monitoring
- Data processing and data fusion
- Integration of soft and conventional technologies
