Post-Covid 19 pandemic times present, on one hand, a challenge for the next generation of data scientists, and on the other, an opportunity for academia and industry to accommodate the changes, especially given the advances in Artificial Intelligence. The pandemic broke the historical analytics paradigm so dramatically that pre-Covid 19 and post-Covid 19 data must be viewed in separate contexts. The quick breakout of the pandemic compelled both academia and industry to make a sudden jump to accommodate the changing requirements.

Universities and enterprises have adapted successfully to the circumstances by developing new data science academic programs and business procedures that have been implemented swiftly and efficiently.

The following trends have been observed in Data Science, and outline the topics for contributions to the Special Track, but are not limited to:

- Advances in technology-driven research
- Advances in connected infrastructure
- Science in action in a variety of fields and applications: pure science; applied science; science in engineering, technology, medicine, and public health
- Highlights of undertakings by enterprises attempting to keep up with the fast-paced digital maturity required to stay relevant and competitive

These are only suggestions; we welcome papers discussing other issues related to digital accessibility
